Waukegan's Bonnie Brook Golf Course Has a Magical Day

WAUKEGAN, IL (August 30, 2010)... On Sunday August 29, 2010 at Bonnie Brook Golf Course, three incredible feats took place:

- Bob Fuller of Libertyville made a hole-in-one on the par 3, 17th hole. Bob played this hole from the gold tees using a 7 iron at approximately 181, yards for his first ace.
- Jeff Donohoe of Gurnee also carded a one on the par 4, 11th hole, which was playing at 295 yards that day. Jeff used a driver to accomplish his feat, which was also his first career ace. According to our records, this is the first hole-in-one at this hole since October 5, 1985. Since that date, well over 1 million players have played the hole without making a hole in one.
- Finally, Ted Daniels of Waukegan set the course on fire in the morning by shooting a 67. What makes this even more amazing is that Ted is 69 years of age, so he bettered his age by two shots.
