Waukegan Park District and Sugar Skulls Xilotl Partner to Celebrate Día de Muertos

Waukegan, Illinois (September 24, 2021) – The Waukegan Park District and Sugar Skulls Xilotl (formerly Academia Cultural Xilotl) are partnering to celebrate Día de Muertos (Day of the Dead) with Sugar Skull Workshops and a community celebration. With origins in Mexico and celebrated throughout Latin America, Día de Muertos is a celebration of the lives of the deceased. Families create ofrendas (offerings) to honor their family members that have passed away. These altars are decorated with bright flowers, calaveras (skulls), photos, foods, drinks, and items to honor the departed loved ones. Día de Muertos is not the "Mexican Halloween" like it is sometimes mistaken to be because of the timing of the year.

Three Sugar Skull Workshops will be facilitated by Maria Calderon of Sugar Skulls Xilotl on Saturday, October 2; Saturday, October 9; and Saturday, October 16 from 10am to 12pm at the Jack Benny Center for the Arts, located at 39 Jack Benny Drive. Pre-registration is required to participate in the Sugar Skull Workshops.

The commemoration of Día de Muertos will culminate with a free community celebration on Saturday, October 23 from 12pm to 5pm at the Jack Benny Center for the Arts. The event will feature altar exhibits, art vendors, food, music, dance presentations, and sugar skull workshops.

Jacqueline Herrera Giron, President of the Waukegan Park District Board of Commissioners, stated, "The Waukegan Park District recognizes that Día de Muertos is an important tradtion for Latinx families in our community. We are proud to partner with Sugar Skulls Xitotl to remember those departed and celebrate death through free programming and a community celebration."

Jay Lerner, Executive Director of the Waukegan Park District, stated, "The Waukegan Park District is excited to partner with Sugar Skulls Xitotl to host Sugar Skull Workshops and a community celebration once again this year. Partnerships with local organizations like Sugar Skulls Xitotl are vital to enhance our cultural offerings."

Maria Calderon, Executive Director of Sugar Skulls Xitotl, stated, "Día de Muertos is a fundamental part of the families in the Mexican and Latino community, a way to keep cultural traditions alive for our children (leaders of tomorrow). Sugar Skulls Xilotl is proud to partner with the Waukegan Park District to present our Sugar Skull Decorating Program to the community so that this very important tradition of Día de Muertos can be preserved throughout future generations among our very diverse society."
