CALL FOR ARTISTS for the Ray Bradbury's *Dandelion Wine* Fine Arts Festival

WAUKEGAN, IL (March 31, 2015) The Waukegan Park District's Cultural Arts Division is accepting applications for artists and vendors to participate in the Ray Bradbury's *Dandelion Wine* Fine Arts Festival on Saturday, June 6, 2015. The registration deadline is May 15, 2015 and openings still remain for fine arts vendors to sell and showcase their art. The registration fee to reserve a 10 foot by 10 foot space at the festival is \$40. Artists demonstrating their art receive a discounted registration fee. The application form may be picked up at the Jack Benny Center for the Arts-39 Jack Benny Drive in Bowen Park or online at www.waukeganparks.org.

The Ray Bradbury's *Dandelion Wine* Fine Arts Festival is a free annual event that celebrates summer. The festival is dedicated to championing the arts by showcasing local and regional artists and performers, and it remembers one of Waukegan's favorite sons, author Ray Bradbury. A variety of fine arts and crafts include: ceramics, drawing, glass, fiber arts, graphics, jewelry, leather, literature, metal, painting, printmaking, photography, poetry, sculpture, water color, weaving, wood, and more.

The Ray Bradbury's *Dandelion Wine* Fine Arts Festival is a grassroots event sponsored by the Cultural Arts Division of the Waukegan Park District and supported by a volunteer committee. There is no admission charge, suggested donation, or gated point of entry. All the performance events as well as children and family activities are free. The festival is held at Bowen Park, Waukegan, Illinois, located on the corner of Sheridan Road and Greenwood Avenue and runs from 10:00am to 4:00pm.

About the Waukegan Park District

The award-winning District employs 59 full-time and over 250 part-time, year round, seasonal, and temporary employees. The District is a member of the National Recreation and Park Association (NRPA), Illinois Association of Park Districts (IAPD), and Illinois Park and Recreation Association (IPRA). The district maintains national accreditation from the NRPA Commission for Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA), the Illinois Association of Park District (IAPD) Distinguished Agency accreditation and the Park District Risk Management Agency (PDRMA) accreditation and sustains a Level A Loss Control Program. The district was a NRPA Gold Medal Finalist in 2012 and 2013, and awarded the NRPA National Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Park and Recreation Management in 2013.
