New Craft Classes Announced at the Waukegan Park District

Waukegan, IL (August 17, 2016) WAUKEGAN PARK DISTRICT CULTURAL ARTS DIVISION- The Waukegan Park District Cultural Arts Division will be offering a variety of fall craft programs. Classes in Basket Making, Hat Making, Sewing, Soap Making, and Weaving for youth and adults begin in September and all craft classes are held at Lilac Cottage located at 1911 N. Sheridan Road in Bowen Park.

Three different basket making classes taught by instructor Sandy Bulgrin will be offered between September and November. Each class will have a two session format on Tuesdays. On September 20 and September 27, students will learn how to create a basket that can be used for Halloween treats or as a perfect fall centerpiece. In October, come create the towering Gretchen tote. This class will be held on October 18 and October 25 from 6-8pm. The final basket making class for the fall, Star Basket, will be on Mondays, November 14 and November 21, from 6-8:30pm. This basket features a woven tree pattern which would be great for holding holiday cards.

Come join professional milliner Linda Crawford on two separate weekends to create a felt hat. Ms. Crawford has been recognized for her millinery skills and crafted hats for the Kentucky Derby. Her two-day workshop will provide both beginners and advanced students with professional techniques on making a derby inspired hat. Each student will take home one hat. The first session runs the weekend of September 17, and the second session the weekend of October 15. The hours are Saturday 10am-5pm, and Sunday 2-6pm.

The newest craft classes are Intro to Sewing (age 8+) and Intermediate Sewing (age 14+) with instructor Lydia Florez-Clemmons. These classes run back to back on Monday nights beginning September 12, from 5:30-6:30pm, and then 6:45-7:45pm. The introductory class will expose students to the basics of sewing and how to craft small hand sewn projects, while the intermediate class will allow students to refine their sewing skills.

We are very pleased to bring back Soap Making this fall. The new program is taught by instructor Katherine Hughes, who has taught soap making and fiber classes at Lilac Cottage and at a number of gaming and comic conventions. Two sessions will be offered this fall, the first is Thursday September 29 and the second, Thursday October 27, both from 6-8pm. Students will be introduced to making cold process soap with fats, lye, and optional fragrance. The class will cover how the process works and safety. Students will leave with two pounds of their own hand-made soap.
