3.12 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

A Waukegan Park District resident is a person whose home is within the boundaries of the park district. Residency is the permanent and principal address of the individual occupying the home, apartment, condominium or estate. Individuals do not have to be related as long as they are living full-time in the household. Please note that the City of Waukegan and the Waukegan Park District do not have the same boundaries.

Proof of residency can be provided with government-issued identification card (i.e., state identification and driver's license), foreign government identification card issued in the United States (i.e., consular identification cards) or a current bill (within the last ninety days), including utility, credit card, phone, and mortgage bills. Children 13 and younger, without an ID, accompanied by an adult will use that adult's residency verification. If a first-time customer or minor without a parent wants to use the Park District, the District will honor the initial visit to facilities, programs, or drop-in classes. If residents are unable to produce forms of identification, we will work with each person on a case-by-case basis to determine resident or non-resident status.

Rental Property: Owners of rental property who reside outside the park district boundaries are considered non-resident. The property is rented to others who may be classified as Waukegan Park District residents because they have established permanent residency at the location.

Commercial Property: Owners of commercial property who reside outside the park district are considered non-resident.
